



INFORMATION FOR CAMEROONIANS RESIDENT IN JAPAN.

Dear Compatriots,

On Friday 22 July 2011, I organized a working dinner open to all Cameroonians as part of the regular consultations with our community resident in Japan.

It was an occasion to take stock of the general well being of all Cameroonians and to discuss the problems facing our community. This dinner was attended by many of you including representatives of the Association of Cameroonians Resident in Japan (ACAJA).

To those of our compatriots who could not attend, due to their busy schedules, I would like to use this medium to inform you of the key announcement I made during the reception.

During the just concluded Parliamentary Session, a bill was voted into law enabling Cameroonians resident overseas to participate in the forthcoming presidential elections. This bill was promulgated into Law by The President of the Republic instituting the right to vote for Cameroonians in the Diaspora.

Following this announcement, several questions were raised relating to the general conduct of the elections in Japan and other issues concerning eligibility and voter registration.

I would like to reiterate that at this stage, the Embassy awaits clarifications from ELECAM concerning the conduct of these elections and as soon as this information is available, I will make a posting on the website of the Mission.

I would like to seize this opportunity to convey to you all and your families, my most sincere best wishes and to urge you to always maintain the spirit of Patriotism.
